


- Write about the beginning, middle, and end of the story.

 - Ask the character about a specific part of the book, ask about their feelings, or why they did something. Tell the character your thoughts about the book!

**Books may be read independently or with a family member. All students are expected to complete the projects independently and outside of school to show their understanding of the text!




























